MINSEOK AN EDD '93

Dr. Minseok An has served as a member of the South Korean National Assembly, that nation's highest federal governing body, since 2004. Beginning as a student at Seoul National University in 1982, An protested against the military regime of that time and disagreed with the militaristic treatment of sports and lack of a quality physical education system.

As a young physical education teacher in 1987, An quickly challenged the traditional methods and clashed with educational leaders. He openly criticized the treatment

of athletes in the Seoul 1988 Olympics and suffered repercussions toward his career as a result. To better understand sports in society, policy, and culture and to better affect change in his home country, An sought further education in the sociology of sport in the United States.

After earning his Doctorate of Education in sociology of sport at UNC in 1993, An returned to South Korea and dedicated his career to positive change within sport policies and the use of sport to foster a more open and democratic society.

Even as his views became unpopular among his peers, An didn't sway from his life-long dedication to human rights activism, athlete's rights, ethical sports policies and making quality physical education available to all students.

"An has been outstanding in his commitment toward public education, public physical education and sports. His work has made a positive impact toward improving sports in the schools, in community recreation programs and through various other kinds of bills that have nurtured or encouraged widespread participation in sports," said UNC Professor Emeritus George Sage, advisor and nominator for An.

In 2001, An founded the People's Coalition for Sports, a non-governmental organization dedicated to improving South Korean sports policies, protecting athletes' rights, providing community sports programs, and growing a positive relationship between North and South Korea through shared sports activities.

Although repeatedly faced with opposition to his agenda, An has continued to build a vast body of research as a sport sociologist and educator. Since his election to the South Korean National Assembly, An has created numerous pieces of legislation aimed at making physical education and sports accessible to all students in school as well as at the community level. He has championed the ethical balance of sports and education, health, and treatment of student-athletes as well as the establishment of ethical standards for leaders in sport.

Dr. Dan Carey spent 19 years as a college president, having provided transformational leadership through enrollment growth, improved retention, expanded fundraising and strengthened financial viability during both his tenures, as president of Edgewood College in Madison, Wis., (2004-2014) and as president of his alma mater, Benedictine College in Atchison, Kan., (1995-2004). Carey also served as vice president at St. Mary's University in San Antonio, Texas, and at St. Louis University.

After retiring in 2014, Carey made a positive impact

on higher education as a consultant and executive coach with a team he helped found that provides professional development for leaders in education, and leads an annual workshop, Aspiring to the College Presidency. Carey's focus lies in enhancing campus community, putting students first, expanding and strengthening academic programs, and leading through building strong relationships.

After earning his bachelor's degree in English from Benedictine College, Carey completed his MA in Psychology, Counseling and Guidance and his PhD in College Student Personnel Administration from the University of Northern Colorado.

"When I was stationed at Ft. Carson, Colorado, before going to Vietnam, I absolutely fell in love with everything about Colorado. UNC had exactly the programs I was interested in, thus, one of the best decisions of my life was finalized."

As part of his postdoctoral studies, Carey attended Harvard University's Institute for Educational Management in 1986. He was awarded a Fulbright Grant to study and observe educational developments and international education in the Federal Republic of Germany in 1995.

Carey is also a decorated Vietnam War veteran. Prior to entering higher education, he was a platoon leader and company commander in the U.S. Army. He later served as a Squadron Commander in the U.S. Air Force Reserve. He retired as a full Colonel.

He has served as Chair of the Board for the National Association of Independent Colleges, on the Board for the Council of Independent Colleges, and continues to serve on the Board of the Westerman Foundation. Carey has appeared before Congressional hearings to discuss various higher education issues and continues to champion quality higher education leadership.





ROBERT A. CLARK BA '60

Robert A. Clark has combined his life-long love of the water with the degrees in Art and Business he earned from UNC to turn what started as a scuba diving hobby into an industry-changing passion, a successful business and career.

Clark started skin diving at age seven while living on Catalina Island, where his father was stationed during World War II. After the war, his family eventually settled back in his birthplace of Sidney, Neb., where he continued to follow his passion for diving. After graduating from UNC in 1960, Clark earned diving instructor certification and opened his

first diving equipment store in 1965. He went on to help found the National Association of Scuba Diving Stores and, later, Scuba Schools International (SSI), which became the largest certification agency for scuba diving in the world. By 1970, Clark had a small chain of retail diving equipment stores in western Nebraska and Colorado. During that time, he became a diving instructor trainer and developed an industry reputation for his skill in teaching and the success of his sales business.

"UNC provided me the fundamentals I needed to make my business successful, and much of my life has been predicated on the lessons I learned there. UNC was profound in that regard."

In 1974, Clark assumed leadership of SSI, and has grown the program to the premier scuba certification program worldwide. SSI instruction materials, through Clark's leadership, became the first integrated instructional system in diving, have been translated into 31 languages and have been used in more than 58 countries.

In 1994, Clark received the Platinum Pro 5000 Award for completing 5000 scuba dives and for his many contributions to the sport and business of scuba diving. In 1996, he was inducted into the Diving Equipment and Marketing Association (DEMA) Scuba Diving Hall of Fame and was presented the Reaching Out Award, recognizing Clark among notable pioneers of the industry, including Jacques Cousteau, Lloyd Bridges, and others. In 1997, the Academy of Underwater Arts and Science (AUAS) presented Clark with the NOGI Award in Education in honor of the numerous texts and educational systems he has developed over the years. Also, in 1997, Clark founded the Platinum Pro Foundation, a non-profit dedicated to getting children involved in the sport of scuba diving, supporting underprivileged children, and educating all children about the delicate nature of the waters of the world.

Clark and his wife, Marilyn, endowed the Robert A. and Marilyn Clark Scholarship in the Arts at UNC in 2014.

DR. SOMPHOL "PIA" DOUNGLOMCHUNT (BA '74, MA '75, EDD '81)

Dr. Somphol "Pia" Dounglomchunt has demonstrated extraordinary dedication to UNC resulting in a positive and long-lasting global impact to the University. Through his global vision and commitment to education at all levels, students in Thailand as well as Greeley have been afforded life changing educational opportunities.

Dounglomchunt enjoyed a long career at Aims Community College, beginning there in 1976 working parttime in the Aims Physical Plant to retiring as the college's Director of International Programs in 2004. In 2005, Aims recognized Dounglomchunt and his wife, Songsri "Toot"

Dounglomchunt, as Honorary Fellows for their outstanding commitment to higher education.

"I would like others to come to the United States and experience our education. I would like them to have the same experience I had here at UNC."

In 1989, Dounglomchunt and his wife initiated an International Program between Kasetsart University in Bangkok, University Schools in Greeley and Aims Community College that enables several Thai students and teachers to travel to Greeley each year to attend the University Schools, learn English at Aims, and, for the teachers, study topics at Aims and UNC that will benefit students back in Thailand. The couple facilitates placement of these students with host families and regularly welcomes students to stay in their own home. Dounglomchunt also ensures students experience the joy of living in Colorado by organizing trips to museums, hiking, skiing, and more.

For many years, the Dounglomchunts have made annual visits to Thailand to serve as volunteer ambassadors for recruiting students to UNC. He has been a dedicated supporter and mentor to UNC's Thai students, regularly hosting gatherings in his home and attending events organized by the UNC Thai Student Association. Dounglomchunt has helped organize two UNC alumni gatherings in Bangkok, each of which was attended by more than 100 alumni and their families.

Dounglomchunt has helped facilitate collaborative agreements between UNC and several Thai universities, including Chulalongkorn, Kasetsart, and Burapha, which have resulted in UNC faculty members going to Thailand for sabbatical leaves, to do research, and to give lectures and keynote addresses. He has also facilitated visits to Greeley from the Minister of Health in Thailand as well as a visit from one of its Royal Princesses.

For his work helping to internationalize Thailand, Dounglomchunt received a prestigious honorary doctorate from Kasetsart University in 2010.

Remaining true to the Phelps family motto of "Contribute, Achieve, Pay-it-Forward," or CAP, Bob and Bonnie have supported students at UNC through the creation of several endowed scholarships and awards. The Brian Phelps Scholarships support students majoring in Communication Studies as well as students majoring in Mathematics with an emphasis in Secondary Education. Bob and Bonnie have also created the Phelps Family CAP Awards to recognize annually three students who exemplify those key principles. Recipients are selected based on their exceptional and exemplary commitment to volunteerism in service to the community; achievement, self-reliance and accomplishing goals; and meaningful and positive acts of kindness and caring for others.

In addition to supporting individual students through their scholarships, the Phelps made a substantial gift toward the renovation of the Financial Education Center within UNC's Monfort College of Business in 2013. Their gift sponsored the state-of-the-art Phelps Family Teaching Lab that provides access to and visibility for financial literacy for students across campus.

With a background in small business ownership preceded by decades of corporate experience in human resources management, Bob Phelps knows personal financial decision-making can trouble many people throughout their lives. With encouragement from the Phelps, UNC has integrated a Personal Financial Literacy course into its liberal arts core, affecting a positive impact on the financial health of students that extends far beyond their beginnings at UNC.

The impact of the Phelps' acts of kindness and generosity has been immeasurably impressed upon UNC's students as well as upon the communities in which they will go on to thrive.
