Columbine Award

Andra Schmidt Bookman



Wisdom, devotion, and leadership on many levels characterize the 1979 Columbine Award winner.

Andra Schmidt Bookman persisted in the attainment of a bachelor of arts degree at UNC from 1957-70. Fund raising, Cub Scouts, school affairs and governmental studies began her public career. The first female ever named to the State Highway Commission, she has been chairman for the past two years. She is also the first woman board member of the Greeley National Bank, and writes a weekly column for the *Town and Country* newspaper.

An achiever and contributor, a woman in ascension, Andra Schmidt Bookman utilizes her education and talents to serve home, community, and state.

Distinguished Alumnus Award

J. Gilbert Hause



Perception, perfection, perseveration -an alliteration expressing some essentials about the 1979 Distinguished Alumnus.

From 1955-77, prior to accepting the presidency of Black Hills State College, Dr. J. Gilbert Hause served this University as an administrator in admissions, administrative services, academic services, and public affairs; assistant to the President; Pakistan Project chief-of-party, and secretary to the Board of Trustees. Also a leader in the Greeley City Council, Kiwanis Club, Independence Stampede, Colorado Municipal League, and Catholic Community Services, he has been a friend on many levels to his community, university and Alumni Association. Dr. Hause received his B.A. and M.A. in 1951 and 1952 from UNC.

Emeritus Community Service Award

Martin Candelaria



A catalyst, a mover, a doer...above all, a teacher who ever offers students and colleagues wise counsel and friendship.

Martin Candelaria joined the UNC faculty in 1948, and retired in 1963. With a rich background as teacher and coach in New Mexico, Colorado, and Wyoming, and three degrees, Dr. Candelaria also brought his dream of equality in education. Sharing his dream, he was instrumental in making it a reality at UNC.

In 1974, Candelaria Hall on Holmes Campus was given his name, and in 1976, the CEA honored him and wife Fay for "Outstanding Service in Human Relations." His beloved presence has been felt in community and state, and emeritus status has only meant new channels for service.

International Alumna Award

Poonsang Sutabutra



Those who know her agree that she is a most gracious and beautiful lady. Those who enthusiastically proposed her for this honor agree she is most deserving.

Poonsang Sutabutra, earned a bachelor of arts degree at Chulalongkorn University, and a master's degree at UNC in 1965. She returned to her native Thailand to serve both nations as a cultural counselor to high school and college students who wish to study in America.
