## JIM ALEXANDER '69



JIM ALEXANDER '69

**Jim Alexander** has dedicated his life to serving others. Whether serving in his local church and school district, or building shelters across borders and overseas, Alexander's greatest joy comes from helping people in need.

After graduating from UNC, Alexander accepted a position at Aspen High School as a business teacher and coach, where he implemented a wrestling program and assisted with football while teaching. His passion for working with students was so strong that after leaving his teaching career, he continued coaching and found other ways to stay involved in the lives of local students. Alexander spent 18 years advocating for girls' programs and athletics in local schools, and 12 years hosting weekly breakfasts and nondenominational Bible studies for the community's young adults. Alexander has also facilitated high school student exchanges from the former Soviet Union and helped international teens make college possible.

In 1977, Alexander started a roofing company in Colorado's Roaring Fork Valley, and soon after it was considered one of the valley's best, a reputation he still enjoys. His roofing company has allowed him the freedom to help those less fortunate than himself. Alexander has built roofs, both free and at cost, for churches of many creeds including his own, as well as charitable organizations in and out of Colorado.

Alexander has been a board member for The Hands of Luke Medical Ministries, Inc. in El Paso, TX and Casa de Esperanza in Juarez, Mexico for nearly 30 years. In Juarez, he has helped build two dormitories, three clinics and nutrition centers and seven duplex units, much of it at his own expense. He has also helped build homes, and provided education and health care in other underdeveloped countries. He visits prisons in Juarez and feeds inmates Thanksgiving meals.

Alexander never stops giving and serving, and his love for others knows no boundaries.

As a lead volunteer, he focuses on ensuring the foundation is in the best position to support the priorities of the university. ## FRITZ J. ERICKSON '84, '87

**Fritz J. Erickson** has had 30 years of educational, academic, and administrative experience leading up to his appointment as Northern Michigan University's 15th president.

During his years as an administrator, he has created several programs and opportunities for the students, staff, and faculty at his institutions and across the world. Erickson served with the Safe Schools Coalition, helped found and served as the first president of the National Alternative Education Association, began Michigan Technical University's Center for Educational Technology, Research and Assessment, and launched Ferris State University's Center for Latino Studies.

As Provost, Erickson's effective leadership evolved Ferris State into a university with diverse programs, increased student retention and graduation rates, and decreased debt at graduation. His work supported academic success for every student. Since arriving at NMU, Erickson has helped launch the student-run product incubator Invent@NMU as well as a manufacturing technician certificate.

Internationally, Erickson has been involved in the Education Sector Reform in Pakistan, and worked with the US State Department to establish educational opportunities for US students to work and study in Jordan. He has also built partnerships in Hungary, China, and South Korea.

Erickson has collaborated with UNC faculty to write many of his books and written about a range of topics. He has more than 40 works to his name including a technology education series, textbooks on learning outcomes, and articles investigating a range of youth issues from suicide to difficulty reading.

Erickson is known for his strong, student-centered decisions and for successfully developing university partnerships with businesses, K-12 schools and the community.

## BRUCE PEARSON '69



BRUCE PEARSON '69

**Bruce Pearson** received his master's degree in Music Education in 1969, and he has spent his career focused on music education through his work as an author, composer and clinician. In that time, he has taught at all school levels. His series of band music instructional books, *Standard of Excellence Comprehensive Band Method* is used in almost every band program in the United States and many more classrooms across the world. Instructors and composers have regarded it as the most important contribution to band music in at least three decades.

Pearson is also an accomplished composer, having created music for concert band and jazz ensemble. As a clinician, he has led courses around the world, including across the United States, the Pacific Rim, Asia, Europe and Canada.

Numerous organizations have presented Pearson with awards in recognition of his contributions to music and music education. He has been nominated twice for Minnesota's Excellence in Education Award and has been recognized as that state's "most outstanding in the field of music." He received the Midwest International Clinic Band and Orchestra Conference Medal of Honor. St. Cloud State University has bestowed on Pearson their Distinguished Service to Music Award and their Distinguished Alumni Award. The Maryborough Conference recognized him as their First Patron and the American School Band Directors Association gave Pearson the 2014 Edwin Franko Goldman Award.

Having a successful career has allowed Pearson to give back to his alma mater by creating a scholarship for music education students at UNC. The goal of his scholarship is to support students pursuing a music education degree so that they may touch the lives of others through music. Pearson is a world renowned contributor to the world of music, and a proud alumnus of the school of music.

## BOB HEINY, HONORARY ALUMNUS



**BOB HEINY, HONORARY ALUMNUS**

**Bob Heiny** was an icon during his 48 years as a faculty member and administrator at the University of Northern Colorado, and he remains a legend across campus. He loved his work and never planned to retire, remaining at the university until his passing.

As a natural in the classroom, Heiny served as a model for other faculty and the graduate students he advised. Students recommended his class to each other, and his wife Linnea claimed the only thing Heiny could do better than play golf was to teach. Over his tenure, Heiny received

awards for Professor of the Year, the Distinguished Career Service Award, Excellence in Faculty Advisement, Teaching Excellence in Undergraduate Education, and the College of Natural and Health Sciences Excellence in Teaching Award.

Heiny's mind for statistics followed him to every UNC sporting event he attended. Heiny had the ability to track each player's scores, standings, penalties, and accuracy in his head. Because of his love for the Bears, he served with UNC Athletics and the NCAA for 28 years in a number of capacities. This dedication led him to spend time as the Interim Athletic Director in 2004. In recognition of his service to athletics, UNC inducted Heiny into the UNC Athletic Hall of Fame in 2009.

Much of Heiny's philanthropy went to the Linnea Erikson Heiny Scholarship that he started to honor his late wife and support math students with a desire to teach at the secondary and beginning collegiate level. Heiny's generosity inspired those around him to give as well, in particular to raise funds for female athletic scholarships through the Women's Walk. Heiny's team, the Bear Heinys, has raised over \$28,000 with more than 150 team members over the event's eight years.

The impact of Heiny's unwavering passion for the students at UNC can still be felt across campus. He was a friend and mentor, and he poured everything he had into UNC.
