During his long tenure at UNC, Dr. Dennis Morimoto taught, inspired and launched scores of professionals into the fields of photography, journalism, and arts education.

A beloved and respected photography professor at UNC for 47 years, including eight years as the director of the School of Art and Design, Morimoto served as a model of professional excellence: his photography and his prints are consistently featured in juried exhibitions throughout the region, and his enduring dedication to the highest educational standards is evident through the success of multiple generations of UNC students.

“Even if photography was not the path we followed, we still came away with a work ethic and high standards,” said Susan Nelson (BA-73) who was a student of Morimoto’s and, later, a colleague.

His work ethic and professional philosophy is perhaps best evidenced by the advice he consistently offered to his students, “It doesn’t matter what you choose to be, but work to be the best you can be.”

Morimoto was equal parts educator, artist and mentor. He didn’t hesitate to help students or colleagues with problems inside and outside the classroom. In addition to his teaching and administrative duties, he found time to serve the community and the university through various volunteer positions.

Morimoto was an outstanding professor whose work and artistic passion left a lasting impression on his former students and his co-workers. His legacy exemplifies UNC’s institutional commitment to scholarship and student success.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNUS OF THE YEAR AWARD

ERIC JONG SHYONG SHYU, MA-84, PHD-88

Dr. Shyu is currently the Deputy Secretary General of the Executive Yuan after serving as the Deputy Mayor to Great Taichung City and County in Taiwan. His advocacy for UNC has helped establish the university's reputation in the region and orchestrated an invitation from the Minister of Education to President Kay Norton.

In his home country of Taiwan, Shyu has made significant contributions as a successful scholar, legislator, administrator and advocate for those with disabilities.

At UNC, many students and faculty members were impressed with Shyu's determination and his commitment to better humanity. That commitment has never faded, as Shyu has been recognized in Taiwan and China as an inspirational leader for abled and disabled people alike. He has shown tremendous courage and determination through his personal experience with polio, which resulted in paralysis in his legs but never deterred him from pursuing his dreams.

In 1993, Shyu was elected as a senator to Taiwan's National Legislation Assembly where he served 18 years, after being re-elected to six terms. As a senator, Shyu sponsored and co-sponsored many pieces of legislation that continue to protect the rights of children and adults with special needs throughout Taiwan today.

He helped to establish strong relationships that have resulted in more than 10 collaborative programs between UNC and Taiwanese educational institutions.

In 2011, his outstanding reputation as a political advocate and scholar resulted in Shyu's appointment as deputy mayor to Great Taichung City and County, a special administrative district in central Taiwan with a population of 2.7 million.

In conjunction with his public service, Shyu has been an active advocate for UNC. Through the Minister of Education, he helped to establish strong relationships that have resulted in more than 10 collaborative programs between UNC and Taiwanese educational institutions, including cooperative research, student exchange and faculty development. Shyu and his wife Shirley, also a UNC alumna, have also helped cultivate a thriving alumni community in Taiwan, having recently hosted a banquet for UNC graduates in Taichung.

Shyu's dedication to community and to humanity truly embodies the mission of UNC.

Mike and Marilyn Loustalet have shown their love for UNC and its students in many ways over the years—starting a generation ago when Mike’s family provided students room and board in exchange for work. Their tireless passion and consistent support for UNC’s student-athletes truly qualifies them for the title of Distinguished Honorary Alumni of the Year.

Perhaps best known in Greeley for his 41-year career in Weld County public office, Mike was elected to seven consecutive terms as the county treasurer and served 13 years as the chief deputy treasurer; Mike retired at age 70 with a state commendation.

Through their advocacy and their actions, the Loustalets truly exemplify the UNC alumni spirit.

Mike and Marilyn are well known to many UNC student-athletes—the Loustalets have been football season ticket holders and unwavering supporters for many years.

Mike fondly remembers playing football with his neighborhood friends on the old Jackson Field after CSC football games.

Marilynn was born in Loveland and grew up on a farm just west of Greeley. When she was 17, she went to work for the war effort at a Utah air force base where she packed airplane parts to be shipped overseas. After the war, Marilyn worked in Greeley schools, in the local courts as a court reporter, and then enjoyed a 19-year career as a medical transcriber and receptionist for the Medical Group of Greeley.

Over the past 20 years, the Loustalets have given generously in support of a wide variety of university initiatives: the Quarterback Club, Butler-Hancock’s renovation, and the Hall of Fame Improvement Fund. Signs of their spirit of giving are visible all around UNC’s campus, as in the state-of-the-art Football locker room that bears their names.

The Loustalets also value the passion for academics that is actively instilled in UNC’s student-athletes. In 2011, they established the Loustalet Family Scholarship to support local student-athletes and to honor their family’s deep relationship with UNC and Greeley.

“We are very enthusiastic about this school,” Mike said.

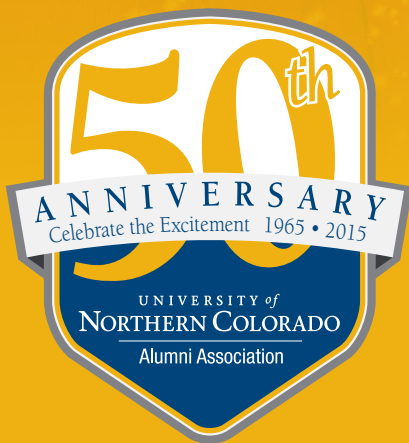
