ABOUT THE PLAY:

The beginnings of THE ROSE TATTOO occurred in Rome, where Tennessee Williams was inspired by the "vitality, humanity and love of life" shown by the Italian people. He placed it in a setting he knew well—a small town on the Gulf Coast between New Orleans and Mobile.

The play is a departure from Williams' earlier line of piercing tragedies, and it was written, in part, to prove that he was capable of writing in a lighter vein. The heroine is a contrast to his earlier wisps of decadence, such as Blanche DuBois in A STREETCAR NAMED DESIRE or Amanda in THE GLASS MENAG-ERIE, for Serafina delle Rose is an elemental peasant woman with powerful drives for grief and joy.

ABOUT THE PLAYERS

Kay Girault (Serafina delle Rose)-

Mrs. Girault is making her first appearance with the Little Theatre of the Rockies since her performance as Eliza Doolittle in the 1960 production of PYG-MALION. Among her many roles with the theatre are the Dowager in ANA-STASIA, the Madwoman in THE MADWOMAN OF CHAILLOT, and Linda Loman in DEATH OF A SALESMAN. Mrs. Girault spent several years with the Cleveland Playhouse, then toured the country with a children's theatre group. Following this she taught for a while in Los Angeles, California.

Robert Holt (Alvaro Mangiacavallo)

Holt studied threatre at Lamar Junior College before coming to CSC last fall. In his year here, he has performed as Mr. Fleurant in THE IMAGINARY INVALID and the Pastor in THE FATHER. Holt is a junior from Morrison, Colorado.

Christine McMurdo (Assunta)

Miss McMurdo is in her third year with the Little Theatre, coming from Seattle, Washington. Among her roles here are Anna Berniers in TOYS IN THE ATTIC, Natasha in THREE SISTERS, Mrs. Baker in COME BLOW YOUR HORN, and Catherine in LUTHER. Last week she appeared as Mrs. Banks in the opening production, BAREFOOT IN THE PARK.

Jeannie Marlin Smith (Rosa)-

Miss Smith is in her second role of the season, having played Corrie Bratter in BAREFOOT IN THE PARK. She comes to LTR for a first year from Shreveport, Louisiana, having performed in THE GREAT GOD BROWN, THE TEMPEST, YERMA, COME BLOW YOUR HORN, and THE DIARY OF ANNE FRANK. Miss Smith will be a junior at St. Cloud State College in Minnesota.

Paula Harpster (The Strega)-

A well-remembered face with the Little Theatre, Miss Harpster is with the company for her third year. Among her outstanding credits are Carrie Berniers in TOYS IN THE ATTIC, Mary McKellaway in MARY, MARY, Eva in THIEVES' CARNIVAL, Masha in THREE SISTERS, and Old Judas in UNDER THE GASLIGHT. This past year found her teaching in Fort Scott, Kansas.

Robert Krautkramer (Father de Leo)-

Krautkramer is a graduate student at CSC in theatre arts, and is with the summer company for a first year. But local audiences will recall his performances this past season as Alfred Doolittle in MY FAIR LADY, and the father in AFTER THE FALL.

Charles Gullett (Jack Hunter)-

Gullett is a junior at Kansas State Teachers' College of Emporia, and is new to LTR. He boasts such credits as Quicksilver in EASTWARD HO!, the Old Sage in THE MERRY FRANKS OF TYLL, and Jackie in THE PETRI-FIED FOREST.

Carol Stolcis (Miss Yorke)-

Miss Stolcis has been teaching speech in Hibbing, Minnesota, for the past three years. She is a graduate student, coming from the University of Minnesota, where she has developed such credits as Mrs. Levi in THE MATCHMAKER, Ruth Condomine in BLITHE SPIRIT, Amelia in OTHELLO, and Madame DuBonnett in THE BOYFRIEND.

Donna Chilson (Flora)-

A newcomer to LTR, Miss Chilson is in Greeley from Tucson, Arizona. She is a senior drama major at Northern Arizona University, where she has collected such parts as Gladys in THE SKIN OF OUR TEETH, Bernarda Alba in THE HOUSE OF BARNARDA ALBA, Lizzie in THE RAINMAKER, and Ida in SEE HOW THEY RUN.

Linda Park (Bessie)-

Miss Park has gained a wide background at the University of North Dakota before coming to LTR for a first year, such as the roles of Mrs. Peachum in THREE PENNY OPERA, Margret in MUCH ADO ABOUT NOTHING, Lady Politic Would-Be in VOLPONE, and Lady Fidget in COUNTRY WIFE.
