WHAT THE PLAY IS ABOUT:

Bernard Shaw's MAJOR BARBARA is a play particularly adapted to our times. Its plot centers around two contemporary concerns, poverty and guns. Major Barbara, the daughter of the world's foremost arms manufacturer, Andrew Undershaft, has joined the Salvation Army to alleviate the poverty in London around 1906. The conflict between Barbara, who recognizes only an honesty and purity of approach, an idealism, as the only solution to the problems of society, and her father, who regards poverty as the only sin and guns and money as the only power, provides the basic plot of the play. As is usual in a Shaw play, the dialogue sparkles with a logic, and wit provides a number of surprises.

This production has been selected as the Little Theatre of the Rockies' entry in the National College Theatre Festival; 191 other colleges throughout the United States are likewise entered. Of these, ten productions will be staged in Washington, D. C. this spring. As a consequence, the settings and production elements have been simplified for touring purposes.
