

- 1. The opening double spread of a six-spread report on the Miura afternoon in Seville, 1961. The photograph could not be reproduced in anything I might do with this corrida. (Page 6 shows how I plan to use this material in a notebook on the Mexico novel. No plans yet for publication)
- 2. The second double spread of Limeno giving a fine pass.
- 3. The third double spread of Jose Julio, awkward but brave.
- 4. Fermin M, rillo's bull number 4.
- 5. A one-age note of Jose Julio's second bull, Number 6 of the afternoon.
- 6. This shows how I hope to use the data in Number 1 as a single sheet in in the tentative book about the riting of <u>Mexico</u>. The pen and ink segments will be quite legible when done with a camera and perhaps reinforcing in pencil if needed.
- 7. Limeno's second bull, the page xeroxed with great care and lighting by John Kings to show what can be done even without a camera. But the notes you and I made in the corral are so perceptive that I think I may want to redo the page like Number 6, u sing the data on Page 8, which goes with it. I retype our notes:






